Dear [Redacted] many thanks for your kind words and also for making it to lunch right after such a long trip. Much appreciated.

I believe it is a very appealing idea indeed to engage on the Malawi, Tanzania and/or Rwanda agriculture programs, particularly if they can be launched together with President Clinton in July during his trip to South Africa. Important in this context is that these programs have climate dimensions factored into its design (ie are climate-smart) and that they "add up" to the Climate-Smart Agriculture Alliance which will be launched in early December in South Africa as well. Again, the Alliance is aimed to drive CSA action at scale, leveraging and pooling public resources while crowding in private finance. It would be very good indeed if President Clinton could support this Action Alliance. Hence, the July announcement could have two elements: (1) the programs in Rwanda and Malawi itself, and (2) the soft launch of the Climate-Smart Agriculture Alliance to which these programs contribute.

In this context, it would be great if the Clinton Foundation could invest around 3 million Euros to climate smart agriculture in Africa, to which we could match with another 3 million Euros to create projects on the ground that would demonstrate the opportunities and impact of climate smart agriculture. Hopefully the World Bank can come on board for this as well.

Furthermore, I have talked this morning [REDACTED] of AGRA and he re-confirmed that [REDACTED] is very keen to engage on both accounts (development of CSA programs and a leadership role in the CSA Alliance to drive action). Let's try to bring in AGRA from the outset on the program development in Rwanda and Tanzania.

Finally, last night I had a very constructive meeting with [REDACTED] on this as well -- I am very impressed with her leadership on this, so I think it is very important to keep the Bank closely involved as we move forward.
